My responsibility, in accordance with Section 426(1) of the Act, is to express an opinion on this financial information based on my audit.

Except as explained in the following paragraph, I conducted my audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that I plan and perform an audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial information is free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial information. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial information.

In common with many not-for-profit organizations, the *First Peoples National Party of Canada* derives a substantial portion of its revenue from contributions, the completeness of which is not susceptible of satisfactory audit verification. Accordingly, my verification of revenue from this source was limited to accounting for the amounts recorded in the books of the Party and I was not able to determine whether any adjustment might be necessary to the amount of contributions reported.

In my opinion, except for the effect of adjustments, if any, which 1 might have determined to be necessary had I been able to satisfy myself concerning the completeness of the contributions referred to in the preceding paragraph, this Registered Party Financial Transactions Return presents fairly, in all material respects, the financial information required to be reported under the Act for the year ended December 31, 2007 in accordance with the provisions of Sections 424(2) (a), (b), (c), (f), (g), (h), (h.1), (h.2), (i), (j), (k), and 404.3(2) of the Act.
