The Act rquires the CEO to publish the Statement in the manner that he or she considers appropriate. Upon request by any person, the CEO is required under the Act to make the Statement available for inspection by such person. You have the following rights with respect to your personal information under the *Privacy Act*: a) to access the information; b) to correct it if necessary; and c) to have it protected. You have the right to file a complaint with the Privacy Commissioner of Canada regarding the handling of your personal information.
