Note 1. Significant Accounting Policies

Purpose of the Organization - Communist Party of Canada

The Communist Party of Canada strives to unite within its ranks all those who defend and advance the interests of the working class in Canada and who aspire for a socialist future. The CPC participates in federal elections, and is active in a wide range of extra parliamentary activities across Canada on a consistent and ongoing basis.

2. Revenue Recognition

Donations to the Communist Party of Canada are recognized as income on a cash basis.

3. Donated Services

The work of the Communist Party of Canada is dependent on the voluntary services of members of the Party. Since these services are not normally purchased by the Party and because of the difficulty of determining their fair market value, donated services are not recognized in these statements.
