- (c) a declaration in the prescribed form by the chief agent of the registered party concerning that statement.

The personal information provided is for federal electoral purposes only. This information may be made available for public inspection pursuant to section 541 of the *Canada Elections Act*. This information will be published by the Chief Electoral Officer pursuant to section 412 of the *Canada Elections Act*. The Elections Canada website at www.elections.ca may be the medium chosen for this publication. The information is retained in Personal Information Bank CEO PPU 010.
