Personal information in this *Nomination Paper* and all associated supporting documents are collected to determine a candidate's eligibility to seek election and be declared elected to the House of Commons pursuant to the *Canada Elections Act* (CEA). They are collected for the purpose of administering federal election voting procedures, and for verifying eligibility to receive election materials.

Any person at the returning office may examine the completed *Nomination Paper* during the election period. After the election period, the *Nomination Paper* is submitted to the Chief Electoral Officer and becomes a protected election document. Information in the *Nomination Paper* and all associated supporting documents may be shared with the Commissioner of Canada Elections or the Director of Public Prosecutions to ensure that the CEA is complied with and enforced. It may also be shared within Elections Canada to administer federal election voting procedures and the political financing provisions of the CEA.

You have the right to access, correct, and protect your personal information under the Privacy Act. You also have the right to file a complaint with the Privacy Commissioner of Canada regarding the handling of your personal information. Your personal information is retained under the Personal Information Bank (PIB) Candidates and Members Elected, Elections PPU 005, as well as PIB Political Financing, Elections PPU 010.
